Mr. Don Bokhart welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Dr. Shelly Wilfong presented her learning report beginning with information about the PLC at Work live event that Wawasee will be hosting July 31 - August 2, 2023. There are sixty-eight teachers already signed up with over one hundred people planning to attend. A few of the nearby districts are going to send a few teachers to join us. Dr. Wilfong is excited because usually a district is only able to take 10 or so people, so being able to give so many people the opportunity to experience that is pretty incredible. The board is invited to stop in and join the event as well.

Dr. Wilfong shared that on May 31, 2023, the Building Leadership Team met. This is where all the Leadership Teams from each of the buildings come together and look at the goals for next year for each building. They spent time looking at creating their 90 plans. WCSC used to do annual performance plans, but the state now allows up to submit 90 day plans. They look at the big rocks they need to tackle, what actions they are going to take, and what indicators of success. The team worked at the building level as well as the district level.

Lastly, Dr. Wilfong spoke about the K-5 Math training that took place June 12, 2023. Fifteen teachers participated and even though Ready Math is not a new vendor for the corporation, it is being treated as a new product and had trainers come in. The teachers seemed to enjoy it and learned new things.

Dr. Troyer shared that the school year is now complete and summer break is in full swing. He stated it has been an exciting year and we are looking forward to some really great things. On June 4, 2023, Wawasee Community School Corporation graduated 184 high school seniors and are looking forward to their impact as they move forward. The corporation is also preparing for the welcome of the incoming kindergarten class of 2036.

Dr. Troyer reviewed the approval of the hiring of architects and construction managers that will be working closely with the corporation on the upcoming building projects. Plans to give more details of the project will be presented at the regular board meeting in July.

Dr. Troyer ended his report by offering his final thanks to the retirees and wished them the best as they move forward to the next chapters of life. Their commitment to Wawasee is genuinely appreciated.

In other items, Mr. Don Bokhart also thanked the retirees for their service to Wawasee Community Schools. He also shared that he was moved by the recent graduation ceremony. He commented that watching Wawasee students conduct themselves in an absolutely exemplary manner was truly inspiring.




Mr. Andy Cripe moved to adjourn the Regular Meeting. Mr. Neil Likens seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0.
